SAINT GILES' CHURCH: THE HISTORY

St. Giles' Church in Ickenham village was founded



in the 13th century when Ickenham was only a small rural hamlet surrounded by farmland. It is named after the 7th century hermit who became the patron saint of beggars and cripples, and Churches dedicated to St. Giles are often situated at road junctions and

gateways, like St. Giles, Cripplegate, in London.

Whilst Ickenham village has changed much through the years, St. Giles' church and its churchyard remain a haven of comparative calm as everyday life bustles around.

The oldest part of St. Giles' dates from around 1280, and the first Rector of the Parish of Ickenham, John Payne, was appointed here in 1335. The North Aisle was added in the 16th Century, and the rear extension to the nave was built in 1958.

The church contains several memorials to local

people, one such being that of the baby Robert Clayton whose parents were living in Ickenham at the time of the Great Plague of 1665.



Through the intervening years many Ickenham residents have been baptised or married in St. Giles' and many now rest in the churchyard or the Garden of Remembrance, where they are visited by their friends and family to this day.

WHO LOOKS AFTER ST. GILES?

The church and churchyard are maintained by the local congregation as the parish receives no financial help from the Church of England. As a grade two listed building upkeep of the church requires the use of appropriate materials and specialist craftsmen, which is expensive.

Members of the congregation keep the church open to visitors at regular times of the week, for quiet reflection and many activities, that include "Diddy Disciples" and the "Memory Cafe".

The churchyard is maintained by a band of volunteers known as the "Holy Mowers" who meet every Tuesday morning, and who always provide a warm welcome for anyone wanting to exercise their 'green fingers' in a good cause. So come join us, there may even be tea and cake!



SAINT GILES' CHURCH: THE FUTURE
